

West St Paul Community Speed Watch

If you have concerns with speeding in our community, please consider volunteering for Speed Watch. The goal of the program is to reduce the incidence of speeding. Volunteers conduct speed watches by setting up a radar operated speed reader board, which display's the posted speed limit and shows drivers their actual speed, prompting speeders to slow down. This equipment is set up in a safe location where drivers can see it, during the times speeding has been predominantly noticed. The speed results are documented and excessive spending patterns may be shared with the RCMP for follow up.

All residents of West St Paul have access to this equipment. Equipment and training is provided through the West St Paul COPP. This road safety initiative educates drivers about the actual speeds they are traveling in relation to the posted speed limit.

Your community Speed Watch Program is coordinated through WSP COPP in cooperation with Manitoba Public Insurance.
